

Walk the historic tradition of the Stations of the Cross in new ways. This beautiful coffee table book features the paintings of artist Kathrin Burleson as well as soul-searching reflections on her creative process and spiritual journey. Each station also offers devotions from key leaders in The Episcopal Church, including Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts Schori and the Rev. Alberto R. Cutié. In images, stories, and prayers, these stations reflect the Passion of Christ, exploring betrayal, judgment, and suffering but ultimately celebrating the great triumph of life over death, the Resurrection of Christ Jesus.

An artist and writer, Kathrin Burleson was born in Petaluma, California, and has lived most of her life in Northern California. Whether painting people, animals, or liturgical themes, her work explores the interconnectedness of all of creation. The recipient of numerous awards, she has exhibited her work in museums, galleries and churches throughout the United States. She is a founding member of Saints Martha and Mary Episcopal Mission, Trinidad, California, and is an associate of the Community of the Transfiguration, a religious community for women in The Episcopal Church.
